Housing Council Notes NeighborWorks Week

The St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators and the villages of Canton, Potsdam, Massena, Heuvelton, and Morristown have proclaimed June 2-9 as NeighborWorks® Week. The St. Lawrence County Housing Council, Inc. is the local affiliate of the national NeighborWorks® network, which consists of more than 240 nonprofit organizations that increase homeownership, produce affordable housing and revitalize neighborhoods

in more than 4,414 communities across the nation.

Since its incorporation in 1981, the St. Lawrence County Housing Council, a private, non-profit organization, has brought nearly \$40 million in public and private funds to bear on the housing and revitalization needs of St. Lawrence County.

To kick off the week, the Housing Council will be participating in the Dairy Princess Parade in Canton on

Saturday. Other activities will include Cleanup projects in Heuvelton and Edwards, social events at two of the senior housing projects managed by the Council, displays at the Farmers' Market in the park in Canton, and a special post-purchase workshop for people who have purchased their first homes with Housing Council Assistance.

The Highlight of the week is the Housing Council's Annual Dinner on Wednesday, June 6

at which the awards will be presented for "Rural Housing Leadership" and "People Who Make a Difference." Deborah Boatwright, Northeast District Director of Neighborworks® America will be the featured speaker for the dinner, which will be held at the Barben Rooms of the Cheel Campus Center at Clarkson University.
